This foyer (residence hall) has a location that, in appearance, is similar to most American University campuses. It has a campus-like atmosphere with landscaping throughout the grounds and a beautiful park just across the street. Individual buildings house students from around the world, with each country housed in its own building. You will have an individual room, which contains a bed, a desk, and a sink. Free Internet and e-mail access. This residence is a "wi-fi" building (access found in common areas). Each room has a direct telephone line with a personal phone number for incoming and outgoing calls, with answering machine. The personal phone number will be given to you upon arrival. Students may bring a laptop computer, provided they bring or buy a high quality electricity adapter for the European electric system. Bed linens are supplied, and bathroom and kitchen facilities are shared. Students are responsible for supplying their own dishes, pots, pans, and silverware. These items can be purchased in France or brought from the U.S. For those who choose not to cook, there are many student restaurants in the vicinity of the foyer. A post office and a medical facility are conveniently located on the grounds. A Métro stop is in front of the building, only three stops from where classes are held. There is also a library where students can do reference work. Students in the foyers usually organize many different sporting activities on their own, and notices are found on bulletin boards. The building has a security system for which students are issued a security card instead of keys for opening locked doors. Coin-operated washing machine facilities are available on site. Rooms are cleaned daily. This foyer is only open to men and women with United States citizenship age 29 or younger.

## Foyer International des Étudiantes

The Foyer International is located in a prime area, with an RER (métro) station right on the corner. The Director's Course is held in one of the classrooms in this foyer during the semester. The library of the Cours de Civilisation de la Sorbonne is located on the fifth floor of the foyer. Students can do reference work while enjoying a spectacular view of the Eiffel Tower. Students will share a room at this foyer, and have the option of living with a French-speaking roommate. Each room contains two beds, two large dressers, with bed linens provided. Bathroom facilities are shared (shower and toilet), but each room has a sink. A room with hot plates is located on each floor and a full kitchen facility is downstairs. Students have kitchen privileges, including access to refrigerators, but must supply their own dishes and silverware (These items can be purchased in France). There are also many student restaurants in the vicinity of the foyer if you do not wish to cook. On the first floor there is a TV lounge for use by the students. Coffee and snack machines are located in the basement, along with coin-operated washing machines and dryers. Students have free e-mail and internet access. This foyer is in an excellent neighborhood and, for further security and safety, the foyer is closed from 1:30 AM - 5:30 am every day except on weekends. Rooms are cleaned daily. This foyer accepts only women age 25 or younger.

## Foyer Didot

The Foyer Didot is located near in an area 20 minutes from the Sorbonne (direct metro line \#4). The quarter Alesia, 14th arrondissement has many shops, cafés, restaurants, supermarkets and cinemas. Students will have an individual room with a bed, desk, sink, shower and toilet and an individual access to internet (about 20 euro per month, purchased online). Students are responsible for cleaning their rooms. Bed linens are supplied. Coin-operated washing machines are around the corner. There is a self-service restaurant on the ground floor that is open Monday through Friday. The meal plan includes breakfast and dinner (limit 72) on weekdays with possibility to invite a guest (using the meal plan). Further details will be given upon arrival. A full kitchen facility is downstairs with coffee and snack machines when the restaurant is closed during the weekends. Students are responsible for supplying their own dishes, pots, pans and silverware. These items can be purchased in France. This foyer also offers a computer room with free internet access and TV lounges. Students in the foyer organize many social activities: movies, dinners, gym classes, etc. This foyer accepts both men and women.
